Vatican summit: hearing victims, taking responsibility

The first female speaker at the Vatican summit on child safeguarding, Dr Linda Ghisoni, said that all aspects of the Church must work together to confront the worldwide crisis of the abuse of children.

Dr Ghisoniøs talk included practical suggestions for accountability in the Church. She offered a number of concrete suggestions: national guidelines to procedures for accountability, including independent councils to advise Bishops; a central office that would promote training and help dioceses function properly; a revision of the legislation on maintaining secrecy in ecclesial affairs and the promotion of greater transparency.
