Children and Holy Week

We are encouraging the parents of children for Confirmation and First Holy Communion, in particular, to attend ceremonies during Holy Week.

Why not bring the First Communion children to Mass on Holy Thursday at 7.30pm? This Mass re-enacts the Last Supper, when Jesus sat at table with his friends and invited them to "do this in memory of me". The Last Supper became



the First Mass. It seems appropriate that children would join us for this Mass in the year of their First Holy Communion and because they are learning all about the Mass at school.

Why not bring the Confirmation children to the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday at 9pm? During the Easter Vigil, all members of the congregation renew their Baptismal promises. This renewal of promises is similar to the commitment given by the Confirmation children in yesterday's ceremony. It would be great to have the newly confirmed children in our parish with us when we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus on Holy Saturday night.

When you bring children to Mass, we invite you to sit as near to the front of the Church as you can. This helps children to see what takes place during the Mass and gives them a better sense of being part of the liturgy.

As soon as you complete the 12 Mass challenge card, let us know so that we can prepare the certificates to be presented to all the children at Mass on Easter Sunday at 11am in the Cathedral.

Looking for God in Holy Week

The kind of person Jesus was, the kind of life he lived, and the way he embraced death, shows us, in human terms, what God is like. Jesus tells us that the whole purpose of his coming among us was that we too might share his way of being human, share that richness of life that he lived. "I have come", he says and "that you might have life, life in Brennan. all its fullness". In essence, Jesus is our window into God.



who believe, to us who are being saved, the word of the cross (the death of Jesus), is the power of God." In the death of Jesus, we see God at work. We must see the cross as the focal point of

salvation history, because the life of Jesus is the working out of the purpose of God.

Holy Week - Finding the God of unexpected ways

Jesus shows us that the ways of God are not what we expect. Through our human senses, we assume that God would achieve his purposes by dramatic displays of superior strength and power, as he is so often portrayed in the Old Testament. Jesus himself had been tempted by such


expectations during his time in the wilderness. However, he was to learn that the will and purposes of God are fulfilled in being conformed to the Father's will, in drinking the cup of self-giving love.
