Daily Eucharistic Adoration in Cathedral



Last Saturday we celebrated a beautiful Corpus Christi procession. Today we would like to say a word of thanks and encouragement to all who take part in Eucharistic Adoration, which takes place each day in the Cathedral from 8am until 8pm.

Here is a short reflection from Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI on how we can allow the Holy Spirit to guide our prayer before the Blessed Sacrament -

"We know how true it is when St Paul says: "we do not know how to pray as we ought". We want to pray, but we do not have the words, the language, to speak with God, not even the thought. We can only open ourselves, set our time at the disposal of God, waiting for him to help us. The Apostle says: this very lack of words is a prayer that the Holy Spirit not only understands, but carries, interprets, to God. It is precisely our weakness which becomes, through the Holy Spirit, true prayer, true contact with God. The Holy Spirit is almost the interpreter who makes God and us understand what we want to say."

Visit of Relic of St Teresa of Calcutta

A RELIC of St Teresa of Calcutta will visit the Cathedral on 26th July as part of a tour of veneration across Ireland. The relic – a muslin cloth marked with the blood of the saint and encased in a cross -The tour



was organised by the Knights of Columbanus, who have been loaned the relic by the Mother Teresa Centre of the Missionaries of Charity. Born in 1910 in Skopie, Macedonia, Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu - who would later become known as Mother Teresa - moved to Ireland at the age of 18 and joined the Loreto Order. In 1929 she moved to India to work with the poor, before founding the Missionaries of Charity order in 1950, which by 2012 had 4,500 sisters working in 133 countries. Mother Teresa died in September 1997 and was canonised in September 2016, becoming St Teresa of Calcutta.
